Simmonds Class

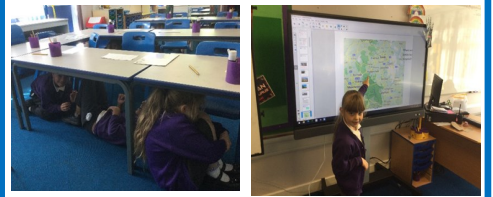
This week in Science we have been learning all about the different parts of the human body. We played a matching game and then we had to label each other! It was lots of fun and we learnt lots of new body parts!

This week we have been learning about WW2 and the impact on the local area.

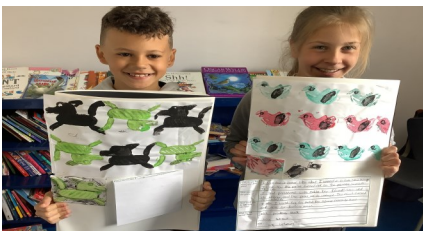
We listened to an air raid siren and thought about what it would have been like in an air raid. We also looked at how the war impacted our local area and the surroundings.

This week Thunberg have finished writing our warning tales with Ms Hulme and we are beginning to look at some non-fiction texts.

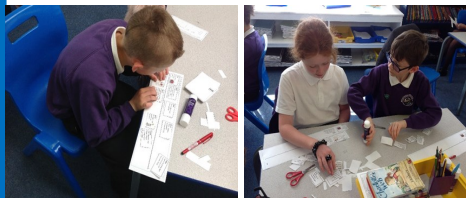
Year 3 and 4 have both been looking at multiplication and division in Maths. We have also finished our unit on printing in Art with some fantastic results.
