



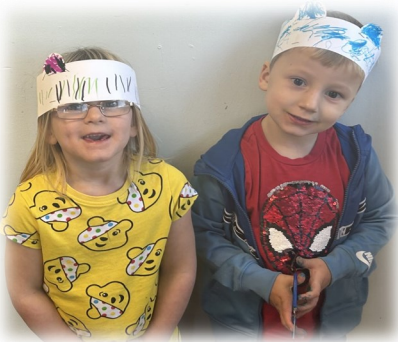
A message from the Head Teacher

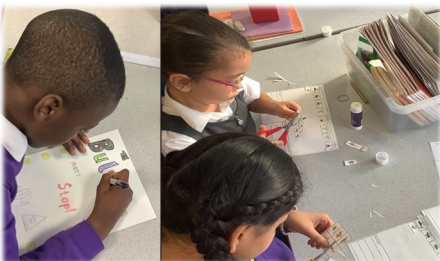
Seacole Class

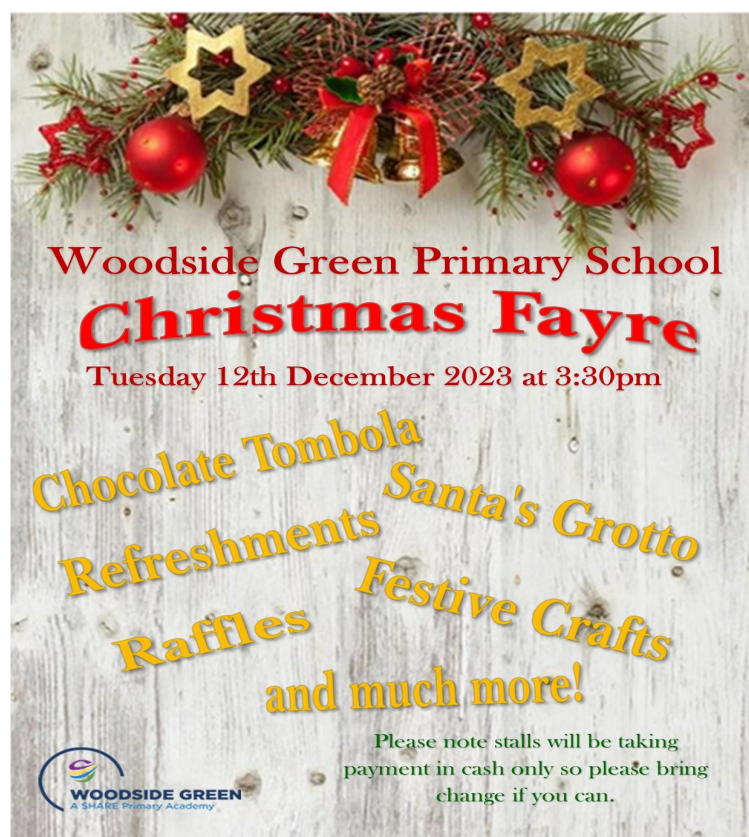
